

## Conditions for Changing Educational Programs Within the University

### (Internal Mobility)

1. Students wishing to transfer to another educational program within the Georgian Technical University (GTU) must comply with the following regulations: Both students with active student status and those whose student status is suspended at the time of registration at LEPL Georgian Technical University are eligible to apply for internal mobility;
2. A student may apply for internal mobility after completing the first semester of study. (The period of study does not include the time during which the student's status was suspended);
3. Students admitted through the Unified National Examinations in 2020 or later may transfer only to an educational program that corresponds to the subject(s) specified in Article 6(2) of the Regulations on the Conduct of the Unified National Examinations, approved by Order No. 19/N of the Minister of Education and Science of Georgia (18 February 2011);
4. Students who are studying in an additional semester are not eligible to change their educational program through internal mobility;
5. After completing the standard duration of the educational program, a student may either: transfer to another educational program only once, or continue studying in the same program during additional semesters;
6. Students with financial obligations must fully settle their debts before exercising the right to internal mobility;
7. Applicants seeking internal mobility to programs offered by the Faculty of Architecture, Urbanism and Design or the International Design School must successfully complete an interview. Information regarding interview dates and times will be published on the GTU official website;
8. For mobility to master's and doctoral programs, the prerequisites for admission to the relevant programs will be considered. Master's students admitted before 2020 may transfer only to a program corresponding to the type of Common Master's Examination they passed. This restriction does not apply to master's students admitted in 2020 or later through the Common Master's Examination system;

### Within the framework of the autumn mobility of the 2026-2027 academic year

9. In accordance with the Resolution No. 212 of the Government of Georgia of May 20, 2026, admission to bachelor's educational programs in the phasing out regime through student mobility is permitted only if it is possible to recognize at least 45 credits for the student;
10. In case if a faculty has modified a 180-credit bachelor's program while existing students continue under a 240-credit curriculum, students applying for internal mobility will be assigned to the appropriate version of the program based on the number of credits they have already earned.

11. Taking into account the interests of students, for master's degree programs, students must be admitted to the existing 120-credit master's degree educational programs in their current form prior to modification.
